Considering an Overseas Position: Checklist	
<ul> <li>1. Evaluate:</li> <li>Know yourself</li> <li>Are you prepared to be away from friends and family for at least 40 weeks?</li> <li>Have you considered social, financial and career factors?</li> <li>Do you have appropriate personal attributes/strengths?</li> <li>Can you speak relevant and/or required languages?</li> <li>Have you ever travelled independently?</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Labour markets</li> <li>Do you have a "comparative advantage" over locals when competing in an overseas employment market? (i.e. why should they hire an Aussie?)</li> <li>Are you able to, or how would you, acquire the skills needed?</li> <li>2. Research:</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>Visa requirements</li> <li>Requirements for working in other countries - are you eligible for the correct visa?</li> <li>Can you obtain a trainee or working holiday visa?</li> </ul> Living expenses – Affordability	
<ul> <li>Can you survive on local wages?</li> <li>Do you have adequate savings?</li> <li>Have you researched the cost of living?</li> </ul>	
<ul> <li>3. Plan:</li> <li>Decide on your preferred destination based on the above evaluation and research process (not your dreams!)</li> <li>Do you have contacts to help you get a job overseas?</li> <li>Investigate the timing of: <ul> <li>Gaining visas</li> <li>Getting the job and</li> <li>Making travel plans (what comes first?)</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
